Jesus' Grace: Love in Action

Grace is the evidence of Gods loving character, which is displayed in his outpouring of gifts to men. Not only does God provide us Mercy by withholding the punishment that we DO deserve for our sins; he exceeds this initial blessing and provides us with unmerited favor that we absolutely DO NOT deserve. The epitome of Gods gracious nature was fully manifested in Jesus Christ. Christ took on the sins of mankind and shed His blood, so that we might be saved from eternal damnation. This inexplicable gift of redemption is freely given by God, not considering our works, and without expectation of repayment. God's grace is also abundant and demonstrated in various ways. Let's dig a little deeper.

Grace is derived from the Greek word *charis*, which has multifaceted tones depending on the context. In the New Testament *charis* is mainly used to denote the act of love of God toward men through Jesus Christ: "being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus (Rom 3:24)." However, it also takes on the personification of an attractive quality, or pleasing impression of one's outward appearance or speech, which we see during Jesus' ministry, "They were all speaking well of him and were amazed by the gracious words that came from His mouth... (Lk 4:22)." Additionally, *charis* is used to signify the attitude it causes, namely, gratitude and joy. These feelings are awakened in the recipients of God's grace.

God's amazing and abundant grace is a dynamic force that should drag our souls from the depths of spiritual detachment and urge us to faithfully serve God, in obedience with an attitude of gratefulness. We should also conduct ourselves in a godly manner, so that we, like Jesus Christ, can attract others to Gods fountain of grace. "As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God (1Pt4:10)."

We are lost without God's grace through Jesus Christ. We need his saving grace as a provision for our sinful past in order to be reborn into a new life in Christ, and we need his enabling grace, through the Holy Spirit, to restore us daily as we try live godly lives. We are convicted felons whose judgment excludes imprisonment and whose criminal records are wiped clean. How amazing is His grace!
