


The Real 20/20 Experience

None of us can make our dreams come true, but focus on them helps us be content with sufficient results based on our best efforts.



Focus of Christ. The Model to Follow.




If you were to ask the average person what Jesus Christ was focused on, what He taught and demonstrated, most likely, you would hear this: "Jesus taught about love. Love each other, and even love your enemies." Hmmm. Not a bad answer. In fact, in Matthew 22:34-40 the Pharisees ask Jesus which commandment in the law is the greatest? Jesus responds with two directives: to love the Lord with all heart, mind and soul, and to love your neighbor as yourself. Such is the "Great Commandment," so love is definitely important, but if it is true that the central focus of Jesus' message was love, explain this: why was He persecuted, tortured and sentenced to a violent death on a Roman cross?

More accurately, Jesus was focused primarily on doing God's Will. This required him to proclaim controversial truths about the Kingdom of God and challenge religious and political leaders. Although Jesus taught to be loving, honest, and humble the part that infuriated his adversaries the most was that he made it clear that entering the Kingdom of God relied on a transformation of one's spirit by accepting and following Him. He would be the sacrifice for man's sins and re-establish our relationship with God. This truth went against the belief that one's works and religious sacrifices/rituals were the way into God's Kingdom, and got him into contentious encounters with individuals whose principles and popular influence he undermined.

Jesus fearlessly and theologically made known the Gospel when and where God placed Him. He was tactical in his mission; sharing with men and women from every walk of life, making disciples of men who were pivotal in continuing to spread the gospel after his death and resurrection. Jesus provides the perfect demonstration of how to humbly serve God and do His Will, and this is the greatest example of how we should model our lives as Christians.

After accepting the gracious gift of salvation, we must seek God's Kingdom wholeheartedly; repent and turn our lives around. In order to understand God's Will we must learn the Bible, so that we may demonstrate and articulate the Gospel authentically. Like Jesus, we should be obedient to God's Will. Allowing our words and display of loving godly character to proclaim the reality of the Gospel and draw people to Christ, salvation, and eventually heaven.
