Christian Fellowship

Fellowship is a familiar word often used in church circles to describe spending time with other believers. Nowadays we use it to describe a range of interactions among believers from worship services to having meals together, and even though fellowship oftentimes involves fun and entertaining activities, it should reach far beyond socializing. Fellowship is a great New Testament concept that is vital to a Christian's spiritual health, and in order for our fellowship to thrive, we must have a clear understanding of what it means.

Christian fellowship springs from our common fellowship with God, "...our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ" (1 John 1:3). Our faith in Jesus Christ bonds us together as the church, and our fellowship with each other is the manifestation of our spiritual connection through the Holy Spirit. The word "fellowship" comes from the Greek word koinonia. Koinonia is a complex word that has such depth and richness that it cannot be adequately expressed in a single English translation. It holds the idea of joint participation, sharing, giving and receiving. It has also been translated as "partnership", and "communion". There is an implication of action and mutual contribution in the word koinonia; therefore, Christian fellowship should result in an incredible unity among believers.

Also, fellowship should bring about spiritual growth. Too often fellowship can become superficial and limited to banal and hastened post-worship service mingling, lacking authentic character and love. We should not be fearful or fake with each other. Our goal is to provide encouragement to keep the focus on Christ, His desires and goals for us. As iron sharpens iron, in true Christian fellowship we should sharpen one another's faith and stir one to exercise that faith in love and good works (Prov 27:17, Heb 10:24).

Furthermore, we should aim to fellowship with one another as often as possible, not only when prompted by formal church activities or reminded by church leadership. It is invigorating and exciting to evangelize and share our faith with others, but the walk can be hard and it is in discouraging times another believer can provide the encouragement to move forward. Most importantly, our fellowship should bring glory to God. Our display of love and support to one another should influence lost souls to become a part of the fellowship with Christ and His body of believers.
