Portrait of a Godly Woman By Ashley Smith

For centuries many God-fearing women have looked to the woman of Proverbs 31 as the epitome of a godly woman. Although this woman is described as the ideal wife for a city elder, her depiction highlights several essential qualities of a godly woman; whether married, single, or widowed.

It is critical that we understand how to be God's woman and not be deceived by the world. Society has a high regard for a woman's outward appearance, and a woman's use of beauty and charm has become an acceptable means of gaining power, prestige and wealth. People glorify the provocative woman with the tough demeanor; she is portrayed as strong and independent, whereas the more reserved, quiet woman is characterized as naïve and weak. You may unconsciously find yourself adopting the character of what is acceptable in society; however, as women of God it is important to measure our womanliness by God's standards.

First, a godly woman confesses that she is a sinner and turns to Jesus Christ as her Savior. She seeks spiritual growth and is determined to strengthen her relationship with God, so she studies His word, remains in fervent prayer, and fellowships with other believers, always trying to draw nearer to God.

Secondly, a godly woman's outward qualities are a preview into her inner essence. Her kind, humane speech reveal a calm spirit as *she opens her mouth in wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue* (Proverbs 31:26). Her consideration of her family and the needy before herself reveal humility as *she reaches out to the poor and extends her hand to the needy* (Proverbs 31:20). 1Pet 3:3). She has style but does not purposefully draw attention to her outward appearance. A godly woman seeks to bring attention to Christ and would not want her merciless words, egotistic behavior, or indecent attire to conceal the light that we are to shine (Matt 5:16).

Finally, scripture clearly describes a godly woman as an enterprising woman. The praised and capable woman in Proverbs 31 makes and sells linen garments, works with willing hands, and even buys a field and plants a vineyard. She is active and creative, able to watch over the household, and possess a business acumen that highlights her good judgment and labels her trustworthy. She is not in "bondage" only doing house chores and bearing children, as society would have you believe. Quite contrarily, a godly woman can "do it all" without forfeiting faith, humility, or submission to God.
